3.1. Area of activity in which the processing is carried out

To raise awareness on environmental issues among Europeans, to profile the European Union, the EEA in particular, as a reliable and accessible source of information by strengthening two-way communication with the wider public, and to increase visits to the EEA's information sources (website, social media channels, map viewers, etc...) by new audiences. This will be an online competition where four participants will receive cash prize and one participant will receive a Public's choice award.

4. Lawfulness and purpose of the processing

4.1. Legal basis

The processing operation is necessary for the performance and the support of the numerous tasks carried out by the EEA as mandated by Regulation (EC) No 401/2009 of 23 April 2009 on the EEA and on the Eionet.

4.2. Grounds for lawfulness

The data processing is considered lawful because it is necessary for the performance of tasks carried out in the public interest on the basis of Regulation (EC) 401/2009 (Article 5(a) of Regulation (EC) No 45/2001).

Through submission of an application, the data subject unambiguously gives his/her consent to the processing operation (Article 5(d) of Regulation (EC) No 45/2001).

There is no restriction under Article 20 of Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 and the data and processing operation do not require prior checking pursuant to Article 27 of that Regulation.

4.3. Purpose of the processing

Management and follow-up of submissions and inform the short-listed participants and the winners; communicate with the winners when the EEA wishes to use the photography in its publications.

6. Retention practice of personal data

All personal data processed in connection with the competition will be held on record for a short period after the end date of submission for the purpose of ensuring fulfilment of the competition and then deleted, at the latest by 30 October 2017. This retention period is appropriate for the purpose of managing the competition while it is still on-going and afterwards to contact the winners and ask their consent when the EEA wishes to use the photography in its publications.

No personal data will be processed and kept for historical, statistical or scientific purposes.

8. Recipients or categories of recipients to whom the data might be disclosed
