Michal Pastvinský is Director of the International Relations Department and Deputy Director General of the International Relations and Environmental Policy Section of the Ministry of Environment of the Czech Republic.

Michal is a Diploma holder from the Czech Technical University in Prague (MSc in Mechanical Engineering) and has a degree from Brno University of Technology – Forensic Engineering in Economy and Transport.

He started his career at the Ministry of Industry and Trade (1994) as Head of EU Programme Management Unit “Phare Energy”. Between 1999 – 2009 he served in broad range of management positions dealing with bilateral as well as multilateral international cooperation of the Czech Ministry of Environment and its subordinate institutions. In 2009 Michal was appointed for a 4 year period as the Director of the Czech Development Agency, independent governmental body of Czech Foreign Ministry.
