## **Record of proceedings:**

The Chair started the meeting by paying farewell to Andrzej Jagusiewicz, and thanking him for his enthusiasm and dedication to the work of the EEA during his tenure as MB Poland and in his role of Vice-Chair in the Bureau.

Further to that, the Chair, Elisabeth Freytag-Rigler, welcomed new Board members and presented apologies on behalf of those members unable to attend.

#### **ITEMS 1-2 FOR DECISION**

#### Item 1 Adoption of draft agenda

The Board adopted the agenda (Doc. EEA/MB/73/01rev.2) without changes.

## Item 2 Adoption of the 72<sup>nd</sup> Management Board minutes, 18 March 2015

The Board adopted the minutes of the 72<sup>nd</sup> Management Board meeting held on 18 March 2015 with a change requested by the representative of the European Commission concerning her feedback under the EEAcademy item.

The final version (Doc. EEA/MB/73/02-final) of the minutes is available on Forum.

The members also took note of the tabled MB rolling action list.

#### **ITEMS 3-5 FOR INFORMATION**

#### Item 3 Update by the Chair (oral)

The Chair summarised the discussions held with the Bureau meeting that same morning. The main topic for discussion was the amendment of the EEA Regulation, with a possible timetable starting in 2016 with an evaluation of the EEA led and paid by the European Commission. The process would last between 12-16 months; thereafter a proposal for an amendment of the Regulation would be put forward in 2017. The new EEA Regulation could possibly be in place in 2009.

The representative of the European Commission (DG ENV) added that the Commission services wanted to inform the MB at an early stage, she said that the intention was not to overhaul the Regulation but to amend it in order to reflect the current situation.

Further to that, the Chair reported that according to the requirements of the Common Approach (CA) there would be a streamlined approach to the appraisal of EU Agencies Executive Directors. With that in mind, the Bureau had constituted an Appraisal Committee composed of the representative of the European Commission in the MB (DG ENV), and two Vice-Chairs: Vanya Grigorova (MB Bulgaria) and Nuno Lacasta (MB Portugal). The Committee would decide on the process in line with the CA and HR, and on Key Performance Indicators (KPI) over the summer period; once agreed, the KPIs would be circulated to the MB for decision. In addition, the Chair informed that she would be the Appeal Assesor.

## Item 4 Update by the Scientific Committee Vice-Chair (oral)

Further to her <u>presentation</u>, the Chair of the Scientific Committee (SC) reported on recent SC activities, in line with the SC work plan 2014-2018. In particular she mentioned the SC seminar on the use of underground held in Zurich on 2 June, and the SC input to the amendment of the SC Rules of Procedure.

Moreover, the SC Chair informed of her meeting with the Chief Scientific Advisor of Defra.

The Board took note of the update.

## Item 5 Update by the Executive Director

Taking document EEA/MB/73/05 as read, the Executive Director gave an overview on the main highlights since the March MB. He mentioned in particular the SOER national launches and the presentation of the report in the European Parliament, as well as work being done in areas such as resource-efficiency, post-SOER2015 reflections, the State of Nature and State of European Seas reports.

The MB took note of the report.

## **ITEMS 6-8 STRATEGIC ORIENTATION**

#### FOR GUIDANCE

#### Item 6 MB seminars: outline of November 2015 seminar, and topic for March 2016

The Board reflected on the topic proposal for the MB seminar in November 2015, to focus on Europe's natural capital (see document <u>EEA/MB/73/06</u>). While welcoming the topic, the MB members felt that the scope was too broad.

The Chair invited the EEA to incorporate the guidance received and come back to the Bureau in autumn with a more precise proposal and final draft agenda.

With regard to the MB seminar in 2016, it was agreed to hold a joint MB-Dimesa seminar in June 2016, in Brussels. Concerning the content, the MB proposed to focus on better regulation.

A draft outline of the joint MB-Dimesa seminar on better regulation would be included for Bureau and MB guidance in February and March 2016 respectively.

## **Item 7 International Strategy**

In introducing this item, the Chair clarified that the aim of the paper was to seek Management Board guidance on the EEA International Framework, rather than on the international strategy, which was embedded in the MAWP and already approved.

In addition, the Executive Director indicated that this document was the result of the MB request to reflect on the Agency's international work.

The expert designated by the European Parliament congratulated the EEA for the scope of the paper, which in his view explained the different contexts.

The representative of the European Commission (EC) welcomed the clarification with regard to the aim of the paper; nonetheless, she reported that due to the late delivery of the document the Commission services could not carry out their internal consultation, thus the Commission feedback was not available at that point in time. She invited the EEA to liaise with the relevant Directorate Generals dealing with the scope of international work set out in the paper, and to revise the document accordingly in time for the Bureau and MB meetings in autumn.

In closing, the Board agreed to include the International Framework in the agendas of the next Bureau and Board meetings.

# Item 8 Outcome of the consultation of the Annual Work Programme (AWP) 2016, and adoption of the draft AWP2016

The Management Board took note of the outcome of the consultation of the Annual Work Programme (AWP) 2016 and adopted the draft AWP2016.

The final version of the AWP2016 will be adopted by the Management Board in November 2015.

## ITEMS 9-14 OPERATIONAL/ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

#### FOR GUIDANCE

#### Item 9 Follow-up discharge: MB CVs and Dols

Due to a recurrent request by the discharge authorities, the Chair retook an earlier MB discussion regarding the publication of MB CVs and Dols on the EEA website. In the two occasions this issue had been discussed in the Board, the MB had taken the decision not publish their CVs and Dols, as they are accountable to their governments, not to the discharge authorities.

Given the periodic request, raised again in the process of this year's discharge exercise, the Chair invited the Board to consult with their authorities on the publication of Dols with the view of recapping the discussion in November. Concerning the CVs, she invited everybody to prepare a short CV for the web by September 2015. The MB Secretariat would circulate examples of MB CVs from other EU Agencies before the end of June.

It should be noted that several Board members requested more time to consult the issue of the publication of CVs with their national authorities.

#### FOR DECISION

#### Item 10 Accounts 2014

The Management Board adopted its opinion on the EEA accounts for the financial year 2014 having been already informed about the process at the March MB meeting. In adopting the final EEA accounts for 2014, the members took note of the financial statements and the report on implementation of the EEA budget 2014, as well as the Report on budget and financial management for 2014. For more information see document <a href="EEA/MB/73/10"><u>EEA/MB/73/10</u></a>.

## Item 11 Eurostat Work Programme 2016

The Board approved the draft Eurostat Work Programme 2016 in the field of the environment as set out in document <u>EEA/MB/73/11</u>, and delegated the approval of the final draft of the Eurostat Work Programme 2016 to the Bureau. This was done with the understanding that the final document would not deviate in substance from the draft presented to the MB.

In addition, the Chair invited the MB to provide further feedback to Eurostat by the end of June.

#### Item 12 Re-election 2 Vice-Chairs/Bureau members

The MB re-elected by unanimity Vanya Grigorova (MB Bulgaria) and Nuno Lacasta (MB Portugal) as Vice-Chairs/Bureau members, for a three-year term. The re-election became effective on 24 June 2015.

#### Item 13 Election 2 Vice-Chairs/Bureau members

The MB elected by unanimity Alda Ozola (MB Lithuania) and Maria Peppa (MB Greece) as Vice-Chairs/Bureau members for a three-year mandate until 24 June 2018.

#### Item 14 Internal Audit Capability. Results external assessment

The Internal Audit Capability (IAC) gave an overview of the results of the external assessment, which had led to a review of the IAC work plan for 2015.

The Board discussed the recommendations made by the external assessor with the IAC and approved the revised IAC work plan 2015.

#### Item 15 Priorities Luxembourgish Presidency

Eric de Brabanter (MB Luxembourg) gave a presentation of the main priorities of the Luxembourgish Presidency (<a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>).

#### Item 16 Overview of audits

The MB took note of the report, including the overview from the Court of Audits (CoA) preliminary report given by the Executive Director.

The representative of the European Commission noted that this is the third year the CoA has made comments on grant management and procurement and invited the EEA to consult with the Commission services for additional advice. In addition, she requested that the MB would have access to the EEA reply, when available.

#### Item 17 EEA Publication Plan 2015. Update

The Board took note of the updated publication plan. For more information see document EEA/MB/73/17.

#### **Item 18 EEA Timetable Governance meetings**

The MB discussed the new format of the June meeting in view of the planning for 2016. While welcoming the social event, and the opportunity it provided for a more informal interacting with fellow Board members, a few Board members indicated that they have difficulties with the schedule of flights from their place of origin, hence they suggested a social event the evening before the MB instead of splitting the meeting in 2 half days.

The Chair informed that the main reason for this year split was the half day strategic discussion with the Bureau, the only Bureau meeting in 2015 not used to prepare the MB.

It was concluded that in 2016 the Bureau would hold 3 normal Bureau meetings, the spring Bureau would be dedicated to prepare de joint MB-Dimesa seminar and MB in June. Furthermore, the Chair said that the expert designated by the European Parliament (EP) had invited the Bureau to hold the February meeting in the EP building in Athens.

The MB Secretariat would circulate the dates before the end of June.

#### Item 19 Feedback from MB members

The representative of the UK thanked the Chair for the MB Welcome package, in her view the MB was working very effectively.

The representatives of Bulgaria, Estonia, Finland Poland, Portugal, and Spain, and the expert designated by the European Parliament, thanked the EEA for the national launches of the SOER report as well as the presentation of the SOER at the European Parliament.
