Notes on terminology, documentation and technical data requirements in Annex IIc schema and pricing scenario.

**Data Topic:** Grouping of a topographic data topic.

**Feature types of interest:** Spatial feature composed by lines, polygon and points. A feature can have several attributes describing the feature.

**Attributes of interest:** Listing the attributes for features that have special interest.

**Maximum award points:** The highest number of point given for a Data Topic.

**Comments by EEA:** Comments for a Data Topic, its features and attributes.

**For columns 6 – 10** in the data topic schema (annex IIc) The tenderer should for each feature type and attribute field complete the table with relevant descriptions of the data that is offered and how well it meets the Agency's criteria.

**Features and attributes included in offer:** List of spatial features and attributes to be supplied by tenderers.

**Geographical coverage covered in offer:** Principle countries of interest are EEA member countries. Consult <a href="http://www.eionet.eu.int/countries.html">http://www.eionet.eu.int/countries.html</a>). Tenderers shall list countries that are fully covered. If a country is partly covered, the geographical coverage for the country shall be described. If additional countries are expected to be covered within framework contract period, year of additional coverage must be added for each additional country.

**Update cycle in years:** Scheduled update cycle in years for feature types and attributes.

**Scale / geographic accuracy:** Gives a rough value for the accuracy of a feature type; e.g. 1:250000 equals that dataset has accuracy suitable for use at scale 1:250 thousand at best. As an alternative the Geographic accuracy of a feature type can be given in meters.

**Comments by tenderers:** If a tenderer cannot deliver specified attributes or have extended information for a data topic, a clear short description should be included. Preferred with a reference to documentation describing in detail the features and attributes offered.

If parts of data originate from a third supplier, tenderers should describe in comments the origin of the data.
