TITLE Regular courses, classroom type, in EEA-only groups

1) SHORT DESCRIPTION

Under request from the EEA, language classes are to be set up for groups of EEA staff members. The maximum number of participants per course is 10, minimum 3, unless otherwise agreed.

The EEA reserves the right to add or cancel courses allowing the contractor 2 weeks' prior notification.

Courses are to be held once or twice a week on weekdays between 8:00 and 19:00 for 90 minutes at a time (equivalent to 2 lessons or 1 unit).

3 terms are to be organised along the year. Courses shall therefore start 3 times a year, in January (winter courses), in April (spring courses) and in September (autumn courses).

The first courses under the framework contract are foreseen to start in September 2011.

1) SHORT DESCRIPTION

Under request from the EEA, staff members are integrated in existing language classes, corresponding to the student's learning level.

The EEA staff member will follow the regular language programme, as defined by the school, together with other students. It is nevertheless envisaged that EEA students enrol in courses that can be attended once or twice a week, in an average of 3 to 4 hours per week.

The EEA students should be able to enrol in language courses starting at least 3 times a year, preferably in January (winter courses), in April (spring courses) and in August/September (autumn courses).

The first enrolments under the framework contract are foreseen to start in August/September 2011.

Independently of the format or duration of the intensive courses (as agreed between the EEA and the contractor on an ad hoc basis) intensive courses should be able to be broken down into slots of 12 hours.

Some flexibility is therefore required from the contractor with regard to ad hoc requests for intensive courses. Courses might be more or less intensive depending on the student's needs and availability and conducted either at the contractor's premises or the EEA's premises.

To that effect, tenderers are required to submit a legal entity form (see Annex 3 to the tender specifications) duly filled out and signed, accompanied by a copy of inscription in trade register and/or a copy of inscription in VAT register, where applicable. In addition tenderers must indicate in which state they have their headquarters, registered office or residence, and provide the necessary supporting documents in accordance with their national law.

If, for some exceptional reason, which the EEA considers justified, a tenderer is unable to provide the references requested above, he may prove his economic and financial capacity by any other means which the EEA considers appropriate.

An economic operator may, where appropriate and for a particular contract, rely on the capacities of other entities, regardless of the legal nature of the links which it has with them. It must in that case prove to the EEA that it will have at its disposal the resources necessary for performance of the contract, for example by producing an undertaking on the part of those entities to place those resources at its disposal.
