The European Environment Agency (EEA) envisages awarding a contract to a service provider for the production of a set of complementary High Resolution Layers comprising a characterisation of spatial patterns in forested landscapes based on the High Resolution Layer (HRL) forest.

Type of contract:

Service contract for duration of 4 months, as from the date of its signature

Description of the services to be procured:

The contract aims at detecting and characterising spatial patterns of forested landscapes in Europe in complementary layers to the HRL forest, as indicators of the condition of landscape and forest biodiversity. The HRL forest comprises 2 (primary) sub products, i.e. Tree Cover Density (TCD), and Forest Types (FTY) (conifers, deciduous and mixed forest types). Specifications of the HRLs are available under: http://land.copernicus.eu/user-corner/technical-library.

The objective of the proposed contract is to quantify spatial patterns of forested landscapes and assess these as indicators of the condition of landscape and forest biodiversity. For these objectives, the contractor will be asked to apply a spatial pattern analysis on forest data derived from the GIO land HRL tree cover density (TCD), and forest type (FTY), the results of which shall become a complementary set of geospatial data that go hand in hand with the original HRLs.

The mapping and assessment of selected landscape metrics shall cover the EEA39 countries, and shall be based on the recently developed Copernicus High Resolution Layers forest (GIO HRL 2012).

In particular and as a minimum, the following three datasets will be derived by the contractor and used as input data (on which the landscape metrics will be applied):

- A forest/non-forest mask, 20m spatial resolution, derived from the FTY product. The
 FTY product already has a 0.5ha MMU (minimum mapping unit) and 10% TCD filter
 applied (as compared to the TCD product.
- A product showing closed and open forest, 20m spatial resolution, derived with a 40% threshold from the TCD HRL
- The FTY product showing dominant leaf type: broadleaved and coniferous, 20m spatial resolution, derived from the FTY HRL.

The set of complementary HRL layers shall be delivered together with a detailed documentation of the work flow, production methodology, and used tools in such way that the support layers can be reproduced at later stage, based on available open source tools and software.
