# Title: Green infrastructure for flood protection delivering multiple benefits

## Reference: Negotiated procedure EEA/NSV/15/004

The European Environment Agency (EEA) seeks a service provider with substantial knowledge and experience to conduct a study in the domain of natural solutions (e.g. green infrastructure) to mitigate flooding. Knowledge in socio-economic issues in relation to the implementation of green infrastructure is also needed.

### Type of contract:

Service contract for a duration of 7 months as from the date of its signature.

### **Estimated value:**

EUR 60 000 excluding VAT.

### Place of delivery or of performance:

Mainly at the contractor's premises with one meeting at the EEA premises in Copenhagen.

## Description of the services to be procured:

The purpose of the proposed contract is to analyse various options for reducing climate change-induced risks of flooding through green infrastructure solutions, such as natural water retention measures (NWRMs), and collect evidence as to whether natural solutions provide cost-efficient flood protection when compared to traditional grey solutions. Ideally, these solutions should be considered in the context of the 2<sup>nd</sup> draft river basin management plans (RBMPs) and the flood risk management plans (FRMPs). The contractor will have to explore whether and how green infrastructure has been addressed by Member States. Besides, the study will identify and analyse in depth the arguments for improved coordination and planning between upstream and downstream areas, the potential of upscaling best practice solutions, and perform an analysis of the economic benefits.
