



## Katarzyna Wrona

Katarzyna Wrona serves as **Director of the Department of Clean Air and Climate Negotiations at the Ministry of Climate and Environment of Poland**, where she oversees national policy development and implementation in the areas of climate policy and air quality. Her mandate covers EU climate policy development and implementation, management of greenhouse gas emissions, including the EU ETS architecture. She additionally leads Poland's engagement in international climate negotiations under the UNFCCC acting as a head of the Polish UNFCCC Negotiating Team.

Katarzyna gained regulatory, diplomatic and policy experience at the Ministry of Economy, within EU institutions and across the UN. Between 2012 and 2017, she served at the Permanent Mission of Poland to the UN in Vienna, where she successfully initiated and managed international projects and partnerships in climate and energy.

In 2025, she prepared and led Poland's EU Council Presidency in the field of global climate negotiations. She chaired the EU Council Working Party on International Environmental Issues – Climate Change (WPIEI-CC), managed a team of Polish and EU experts, and represented the European Union at the UNFCCC.

Katarzyna Wrona holds a Master's degree in International Relations from Adam Mickiewicz University in Poland and a Master's degree in International Law from Université de Rennes I in France.
