The European Semester



Brings together several processes

- Fiscal surveillance: Stability and Growth Pact
- Macroeconomic surveillance
- Europe 2020 targets

Different levels of stringency and enforceability

 For climate and energy: coordination and reporting, no corrective arm with enforcement


Infringement procedure possible under existing climate and energy package

Merits

- Iterative communications to facilitate interactions between the COM and MS
- Continued monitoring on an annual basis with fixed deadlines
- Dedicated follow-up for the budgetary/macroeconomic dimensions
- Involvement of high political level with finance ministers able to allocate budgets
- Publicly available documents

EU Semester: merits and drawbacks



Drawbacks

- Limited implementation of recommendations
- No specific follow-up to improve underperformance in the field of climate and energy

This is possible under other legal frameworks such as the ESD

Evaluation of progress and PAMs



Existing EU Semester

- Annual evaluation of progress by MS and by COM
- No evaluation of PAMs

PAMs and projections under the MMR (Art. 13+14)

- *Biennial* ex-ante evaluation of PAMs \rightarrow GHG reductions
- "pure" reporting exercise

No dedicated follow-up

A new "Energy Union" Semester ?

Planning:


- NECPs as main planning document
- Iterative process foreseen for NECPs
- to be updated every 5 years (with link to PA process)
- Including evaluation of PAMs and projections


Reporting

- MS: Biennial reports (content not clear)
- COM: Recommendations are envisaged


