Evaluation criteria



- **Effectiveness:** can often been well calculated (rather objective, indicators are crucial)
- **Efficiency:** can often been well calculated (rather objective, some administrative costs can be measured, some surveyed. Calculating / measuring benefits is much harder)
- Coherence: are there inconsistencies or redundancies, coherence with other pieces of legislation overlap vs. synergies (scope is important)
- Relevance: is it fit for purpose (but is the purpose clear)?
- **EU added value:** is the most subjective criterion (depends who you ask, and what is the 'real' counter factual?)







Q3: Evaluations and CBA: focus on costs or on benefits?







Costs or benefits?



- Overall: more focus on costs (economic impact) "By evaluating, the Commission takes a critical look at whether EU activities are fit for purpose and deliver, at minimum cost, the desired changes to European businesses and citizens and contribute to the EU's global role"
- Much less focus on environmental and social impacts
- Benefits are often difficult to monetise (cf. societal benefits)
 - sectors like eco-systems, biodiversity, climate adaptation (dykes, ...)
 link with the financial sector and insurance companies
 - How do you calculate improved compliance/improved transparency/ improved monitoring and assessment, etc.







Q4: What is the impact of the better regulation agenda?







Better regulation (May 2015)



- Delivering better results change both what the European Union (EU) does, and how it does it!
- Openness and transparency
 - Consulting more, listening better;
 - Better explanation of what the EU is doing, and why;
 - Everyone's chance to have their say
- Better tools for better policies new integrated guidelines
- Regulatory Fitness and Performance Programme (REFIT)
 - DG ENER (streamlining between units, backward vs forward looking, questions about the process how to implement ...)
