


European Parliamentary Research Service

- - > analysis of each legislative proposal submitted by European Commission
 - regular updates at each major step of legislative procedure



Evaluation during the legislative process

-Purpose

- > improve access to information (for MEPs and public)
- contribute to better-informed debates in EP
- strengthen position of EP in legislative process

-Challenges

- bulky documents
- timeliness
- > access to yet undisclosed information



Circular economy package





Circular economy package: background

- -July 2014: initial Circular economy package
 - 'Towards a circular economy: a zero waste programme for Europe'
 - Legislative proposal to amend six directives on waste
- -Withdrawal by Juncker Commission
 - Reasons (beyond 'political discontinuity')
 - Consequences: attention, uproar and high expectations
- —December 2015: new Circular economy package
 - Closing the loop An EU action plan for the circular economy'

Legislative proposals to amend the same six directives on waste

Circular economy package: action plan

-Strengths

- > more detailed measures to promote transition
- timetable for announced measures

-Weaknesses

- > announced legislative proposals not key to circular economy (e.g. fertilisers, water reuse)
- mainly soft measures (communications, guidance, standards, support)
- > many measures had already been announced in 2014 and 2011

Closing the loop: New circular economy package



Circular economy package: legislative proposals

-Focus on waste management

- setting targets on preparation for reuse/recycling and landfilling of municipal waste
- > implementing the waste hierarchy
- > improving quality of data
- -Key issues left open
 - role of incineration (waste-to-energy)
 - > contaminants in recycled materials
- -Key issues not addressed
 - > non-municipal waste
 - > growing material stocks
