






Key considerations


- How does the PCSD mechanism seek to engage the support of political leaders for greater coherence in SDG implementation?
- How does the PCSD mechanism support the integration of the SDGs into domestic and international policies
- How are short-term pressures managed to avoid deviating from long-term SDGs in the context of PCSD?
- What is the role of the PCSD mechanism for adjusting policies as new information becomes available on negative impacts?
- How does the PCSD mechanism support the coordination of the SDGs in domestic and international policies?
- How does the PCSD mechanism support the alignment of actions undertaken at different levels of government for achieving the SDGs?
- What role is the PCSD mechanism playing in addressing potential conflicts of interest among stakeholders?
- What is the role of the PCSD mechanism in monitoring and reporting the effects of domestic policies on other countries?


