Status quo

Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH) is a democratic state with two largely autonomous entities — Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina (FBiH) and Republika Srpska (RS) — and Brčko District, which is a self-governing administrative unit under the sovereignty of Bosnia and Herzegovina and formally part of both entities.

In Bosnia and Herzegovina, around 75 % of the population is covered by a waste collection service, with coverage more or less complete in larger cities but dropping to very low levels in rural areas. Of all landfills, only six meet the required EU standards, while at the same time several others are being planned.

The National Assembly of the Republika Srpska approved the Waste Management Strategy of the Republic of Srpska for the period 2017-2026, but the draft of the Republic Waste Management Plan is in the process of preparation. Some EU waste directives have already been transposed (e.g. the Waste Incineration Directive), but by-laws governing the management of certain waste streams have not yet been approved, so their transposition is incomplete. Several strategic documents fostering approximation with the EU environmental standards have yet to be adopted.

In general, the implementation of the waste hierarchy principle is not evident. Recycling rates remain at a low level and many of the other key targets remain to be established. In the absence of other measures, the low disposal costs are insufficient to drive activity further up the hierarchy.

The basis for making projections or for understanding how performance is changing is weak. There are very few weighbridges in operation. All plants and facilities requiring a permit are required to report data, but the majority of public utility companies still have no permits.

Also, the management of hazardous wastes is problematic. Neither FB&H nor RS have suitable plans in place.

Objectives

- Encourage and provide the basic conditions for reducing waste production
- Increase reuse and recycling
- Extraction of secondary materials
- Possibility of energy recovery
- Safe disposal
- Reduce the risk to the environment and human health and establish priority infrastructure for integrated waste management
- Reduce waste for final disposal management with more efficient use of resources

- Ensure the implementation of the system through legal, institutional and economic frameworks
- Ensure systematic monitoring of the parameters for environmental assessment
- Increase the population covered by organised waste collection
- Create conditions for sanitary waste disposal capacity for at least 5 years delay in all regions
- Remove illegal dumps and rehabilitate the areas where they are located
- Remediate and close existing municipal landfills
- Rehabilitate existing surfaces under inadequately disposed waste (hazardous and non-hazardous wastes)
- Establish the capacity for adequate disposal of hazardous waste
- Establish an inert waste landfill (for construction waste, etc.)
- Increase the overall percentage of adequate waste disposal and the percentage of adequate disposal of hazardous waste
- Coverage of efficient waste management system in agricultural production and forestry
- Establish the capacity for adequate disposal of waste of animal origin
- Remediate and close the existing landfills, pits and tombs used for the disposal of waste of animal origin

Specific targets

Waste management
 In 2016, the Agency for Statistics estimated the nationwide average municipal waste to be 354 kg/person/year (total 1 243 889 tonnes) (¹)
 Official data provide the amount of waste collected by communal services in 2016: 920 478 tonnes (collection rate of 74 %)
 Amount of disposed waste in 2016: 952 975 tonnes

Recycling
Limited number of initiatives for the separation of waste
 Few pioneering recycling projects, e.g. small-scale paper collection
 Limited amounts of industrial and hazardous waste are recovered or reused; it is
estimated that only 10 % or less of the total volume of industrial waste is used as
secondary raw material
Landfill
Collected waste is transported to regional landfills
Only limited transport capacity
Households in rural areas with no available waste collection service organise their
own collection and transport and dispose of the collected waste in illegal dumpsites
No separate collection system for hazardous materials, so everything ends up in
landfills or dumpsites
• 43 registered landfills in RS and 44 in FBiH, and one landfill in Brčko District, with
only few landfills being categorised as controlled landfills
 10-15 % of illegal dumpsites have recently been closed (there are almost 590

Incineration
Only very limited treatment facilities, i.e. safe incinerators, leading to improper
handling of industrial waste

 Cost recovery: unpaid fees can amount to between 50-70 % (FBiH) and 30-90 % (RS)
